This Symposium attracts more than 350 local, state, federal and private agency professionals devoted to reducing deaths and injuries related to traffic crashes. Injury Prevention: innovative programs relating to enforcement, education, aggressive driving, child passenger safety, bike/pedestrian safety, work zone, etc.

Keeping Seniors Safe Behind the Wheel: initiatives that support seniors in highway traffic safety

Motorcycle Safety: safe rider education, enforcement initiatives, and public awareness projects

Multicultural Outreach: efforts to reduce crashes and injuries with diverse populations

New Technologies: the use of innovative tools for educational, enforcement or monitoring activities to support highway safety

Teen Traffic Safety: interventions or educational efforts that seek to reduce teen crashes and increase occupant protection
