


### Speeding Drivers in F&PI Crashes by Age: 2015



### Other Top Contributing Factors Associated with Speeding Drivers in F&PI Crashes: 2015



Alcohol Involvement	15%	7%
Passing/Lane Use/Lane Changing	14%	7%
Slippery Pavement	8%	21%
Driver Inattention/Distraction	4%	8%
Failure To Keep Right	5%	3%
Following Too Closely	4%	13%

### Speed-Related F&PI Crashes by Manner of Collision: 2015



Speed-related F&PI crashes are much more likely to involve a single vehicle than all F&PI crashes (46% vs. 30%).


### Speed-Related F&PI Crashes by Time of Day: 2015 (N=12,400)



One-third (35%) of speed-related F&PI crashes occur between noon and 6pm.

Speeding drivers in fatal and personal injury crashes are twice as likely to be male.
