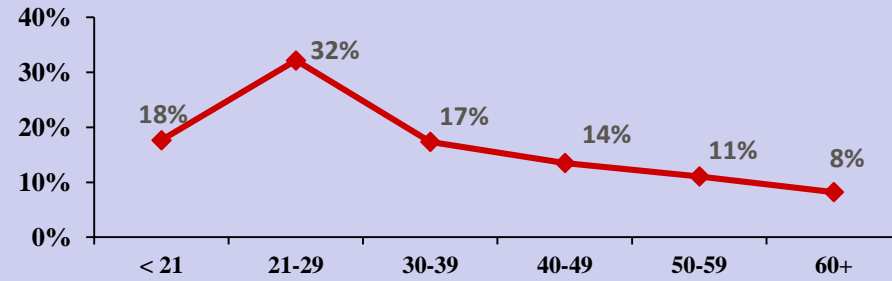

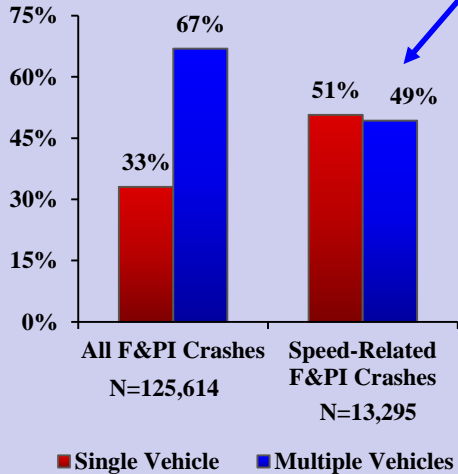
Speeding Drivers in F&PI Crashes by Age: 2013



Other Top Contributing Factors Associated with Speeding Drivers in F&PI Crashes: 2013

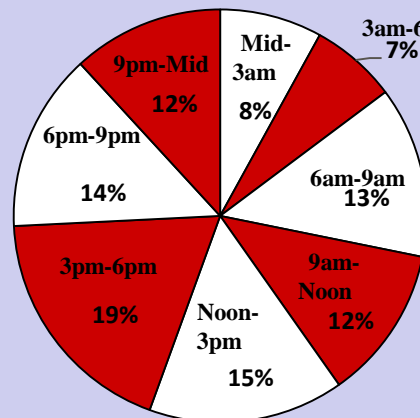

Alcohol Involvement	19%	8%
Driver Inattention/Distraction	5%	8%
Failure to Keep Right	8%	3%
Following Too Closely	1%	11%
Passing/Unsafe Lane Changing	11%	7%
Slippery Pavement	9%	23%

Speed-Related F&PI Crashes by Manner of Collision: 2013



Speed-related F&PI crashes are much more likely to involve a single vehicle than all F&PI crashes (51% vs. 33%).

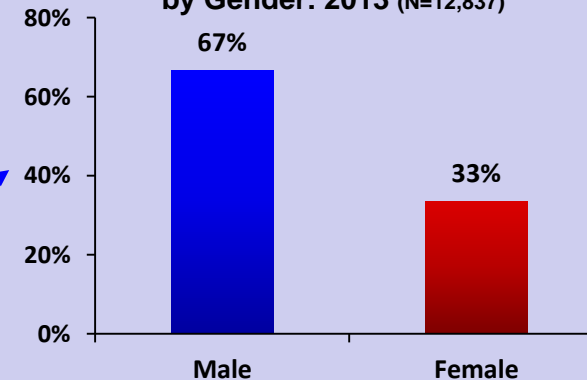
Speed-Related F&PI Crashes by Time of Day: 2013 (N=13,295)



One-third (34%) of speed-related F&PI crashes occur between noon and 6pm; almost half (49%) occur Friday-Sunday.

Speeding drivers in fatal and personal injury crashes are twice as likely to be male.
