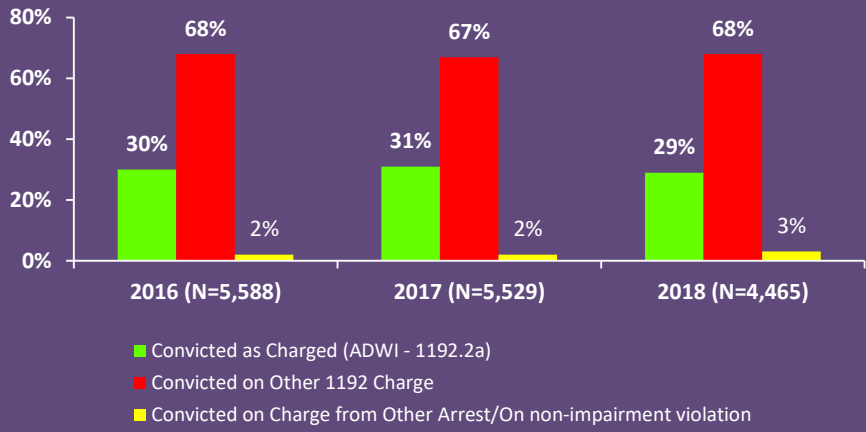


New York State Fact Sheet on Aggravated DWI (ADWI): 2016 – 2018 (TSLED Only)

Provisions of ADWI Law

- ✓ BAC: 0.18% or higher
- ✓ Fine: \$1,000 - \$2,500
- ✓ Jail: Not more than one year
- ✓ License Action: Revocation for at least 1 year
- ✓ Plea to lesser charge of DWI: Mandatory IDP participation, assessment and treatment, if required
- ✓ Convicted of 1192.2a & sentenced to probation: Mandatory ignition interlock

Drivers with a BAC ≥ 0.18 Arrested for ADWI and Convicted Conviction Charge



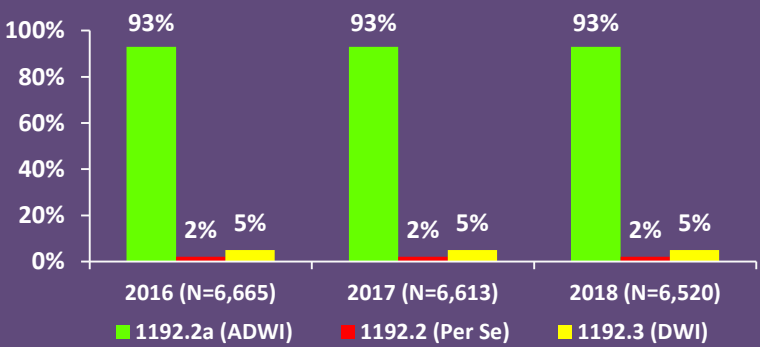
