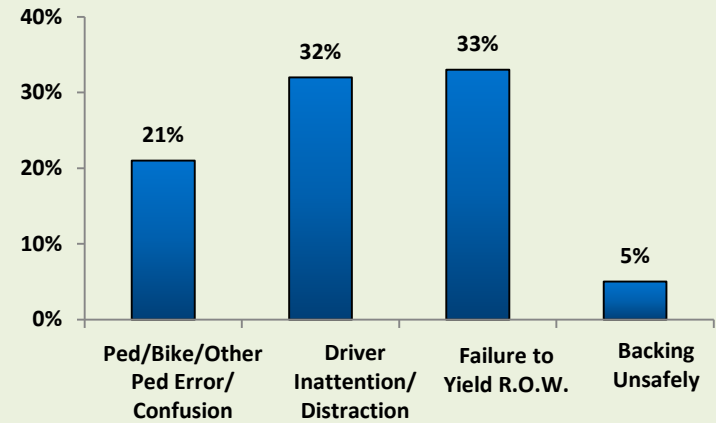


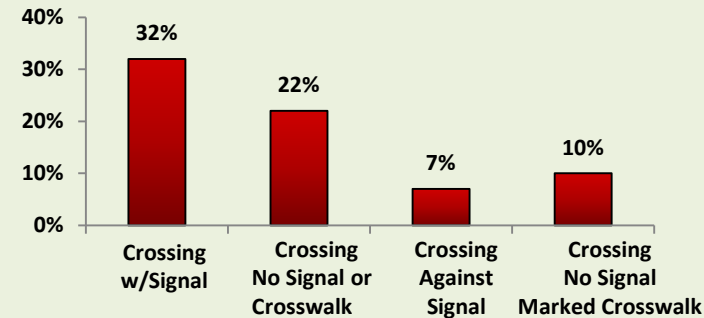

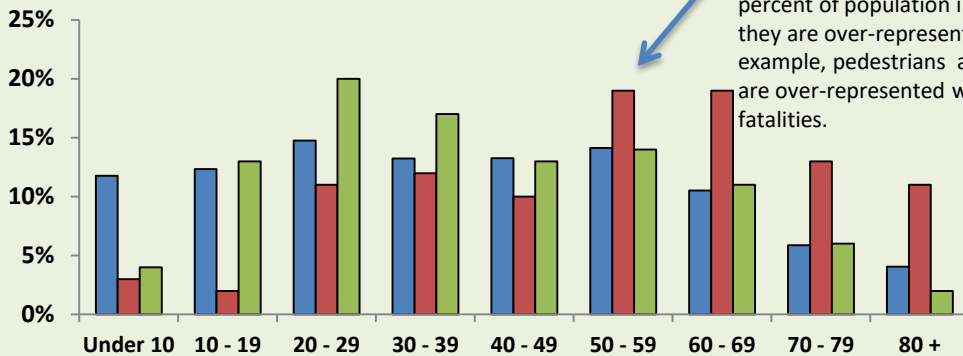
Pedestrian Fatal and Personal Injury Crashes* Select Contributing Human Factors 2019

In interpreting these data, any age group with a greater percentage of pedestrians killed or injured than the percent of population indicates that they are over-represented. For example, pedestrians ages 50 and over are over-represented with respect to fatalities.

Note: Fatalities and injuries refer to people, while crashes refer to the crash event. One crash event may involve more than one vehicle and one fatality and/or injury. All crash-related data were obtained from the NYS Department of Motor Vehicles.
