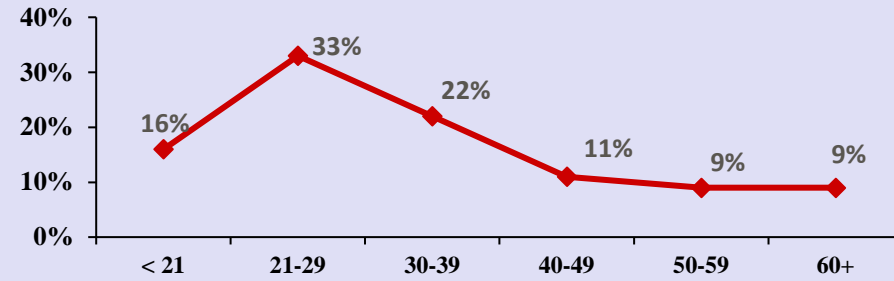

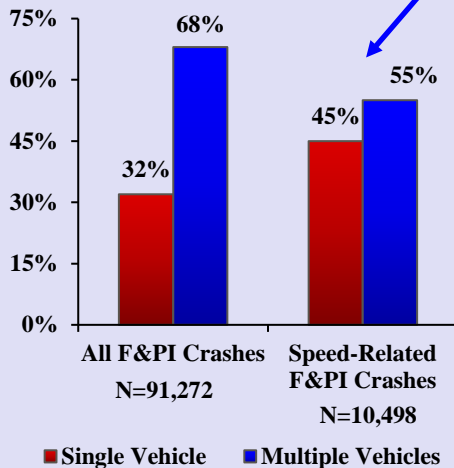
Speeding Drivers in F&PI Crashes by Age: 2020



Other Top Contributing Factors Associated with Speeding Drivers in F&PI Crashes: 2020

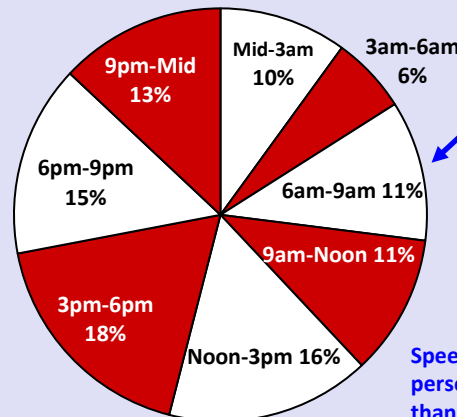

Speed-Related F&PI Crashes by Manner of Collision: 2020



Speed-related F&PI crashes are much more likely to involve a single vehicle than all F&PI crashes (45% vs. 32%).

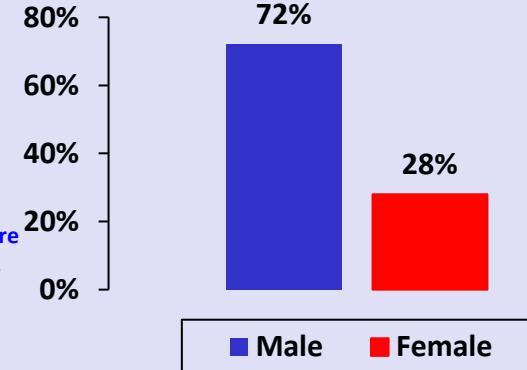
Speed-Related F&PI Crashes by Time of Day: 2020 (N=10,445)



Just over one-third (34%) of speed-related F&PI crashes occur between noon and 6pm.

Speeding drivers in fatal and personal injury crashes are more than twice as likely to be male.
