

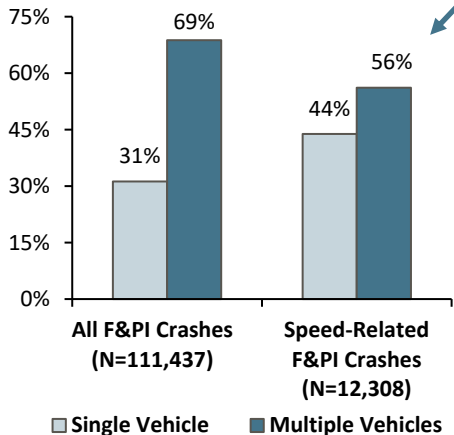

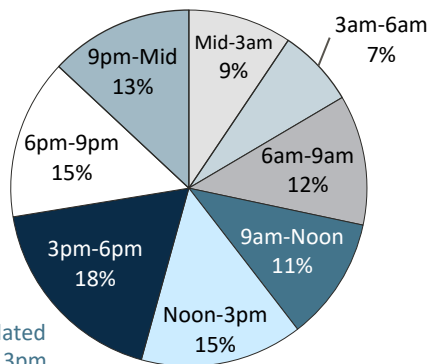
Speed-Related F&PI Crashes by Manner of Collision: 2022

Speed-related F&PI crashes are much more likely to involve a single vehicle than all F&PI crashes (44% vs. 31%).

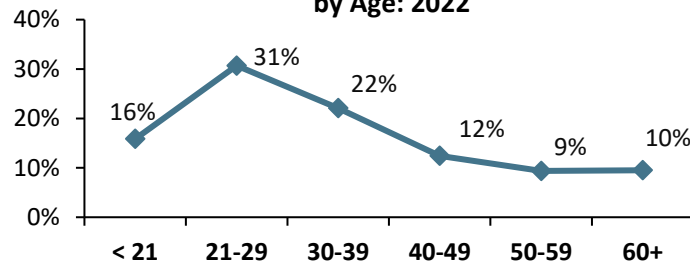


Speed-Related F&PI Crashes by Time of Day: 2022 (N=12,253)

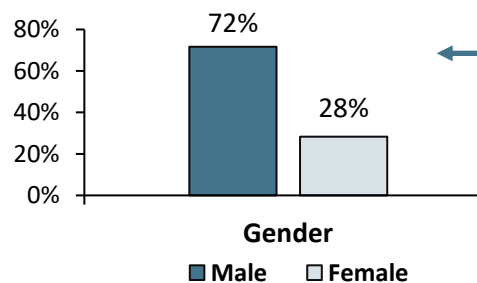
One-third (33%) of speed-related F&PI crashes occur between 3pm and 9pm.
