Governor's Traffic Safety Committee



The Governor's Traffic Safety Committee, formed in 1967 by a combination of law and executive orders, develops and supports the State's highway safety program to ensure safe transportation of

people and goods on New York's roadways. GTSC serves as New York State's official liaison to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), the two primary sources of funding for traffic safety programs. The GTSC works closely with a network of state and local agencies, law enforcement, non-profit organizations and private sector partners to deliver traffic safety information, resources and programs across New York State.

New York State Association of Traffic Safety Boards



The New York State Association of Traffic Safety Boards was formed in 1967 as a statewide support organization for county traffic safety boards and agencies, companies, or individuals having an interest in traffic safety and injury prevention. NYSATSB is organized into eight Regions across New York State, each with a Regional Vice President who serves as a liaison between traffic safety partners and the Association. The Association coordinates grant funding

information, proposes traffic safety legislation, and offers traffic safety resources and education programs.

New York State STOP-DWI Association, Inc.



The New York State STOP-DWI Association, Inc. was formed in 1982. The Association is made up of STOP-DWI Coordinators and staff from each of the counties in New York State. The STOP-DWI Coordinators are responsible for the administration of local plans to combat impaired driving in their respective communities. Collectively, the NYS STOP-

DWI Association, Inc. facilitates the exchange of ideas and information regarding impaired driving. The Association continues to foster new and innovative approaches for dealing with the impaired driver. These initiatives are developed in the areas of enforcement, prosecution/adjudication, probation, rehabilitation/treatment, victims' services, training and public information and education.

#### DERIC: COMPREHENSIVE & STANDARDIZED SAFETY EDUCATION RESOURCES FOR YOUNGER DRIVERS

Younger drivers, ages 16-20 years, are over represented in motor vehicle crashes in New York State (NYS). The Driver Education Research and Innovation Center (DERIC) Project provides free, standardized driver education resources to help decrease the risk of motor vehicle related injury and death among teen drivers. "In Class" resources available through DERIC include classroom presentations, lesson plans, activities, and assessments. "In Car" resources include a sample lesson plans, driving skills checklists, and activities for student observers. Materials are broken down by unit and organized by in-class and in-car resources. The DERIC curriculum was developed by the Capital Area School Development Association (CASDA) in collaboration with teen driving safety subject matter experts through a partnership between the NYS Department of Health (DOH), NYS Governor's Traffic Safety Committee (GTSC), NYS Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV), and NYS Department of Education (ED).
