


Drivers in F&PI Crashes: Drivers Ages 16-20 vs. All Drivers Select Contributing Human Factors: 2018

In police-reported crashes, drivers ages 16-20 are more likely to have each of these factors, with the exception of Alcohol Involvement. However, when you consider that drivers in the 16-20 age group can not drink legally it appears to be a problem.


- Alcohol Involvement

- Driver Inattention/Distraction




Licensed Drivers Ages 16-20 Compared to Drivers Ages 16-20 in Crashes: 2018
